1. Principal's Report

Sarojini Naidu Govt. Girls P. G. (Auto.) College, popularly known as '**Nutan College**' is one of the premier institute of the state for quality education to women. Since its inception in 1970, college has achieved considerable heights in academic excellence and extracurricular perfection. In the current year college is celebrating its 50th year of inception.

The College aims to empower young women and prepare them for a dynamic and responsible role in the society.

The College has been awarded 'A' Grade in 2017 with 3.09 points by NAAC in cycle III of Re-accreditation. After fourth review of Autonomy in 2019 further extension has been granted by UGC. Currently the College has 4822 students enrolled in various discipline. In 2018-19 total admission in UG are 1662 and 557 in PG. Among the newly admitted students 805 are medhavi students. College has 5 faculties Arts, Commerce, Science, Home Science and Computer Application in which Under Graduate courses are running. In 21 subjects Post Graduate program are successfully running 17 self-financing courses are also being conducted. M.Phil program is being run by the department of History, Economics and Sociology. The college is Center for Ph.D. in 17 subjects. We are proud to achieve 87.38% result in UG and 93.66% result in PG Classes in the last exams.

The College has 107 highly qualified regular academic staff and 32 guest faculties. We are honoured to have 4 Professor with D.Litt in our faculty.

Dr. Veena Dani, Professor and Head Department of Psychology was appointed Rehabilitation Psychologist by Rehabilitation Council of India, Dr. Alka Parashar, Professor and Head, Department of Zoology chaired one of the sessions in Aquaculture and Fisheries Global summit 2018 in Japan. Dr. Shobha Shrivastava, Professor of Botany was awarded Best Citizen of India Gold Medal Award by Global Economic Progress and Research Association, Tiruvannamalai, Tamil Nadu, India on 26th January 2019 at Bangalore.

Under Institutional Development Plan (IDP) a detailed project report has been submitted to World Bank Project on 13th Feb 2019 with plan of Infrastructural facilities, Research upgradation (Equipments etc.) and Skill Development.

College students are taking benefits of the various welfare schemes of the government. Remedial Classes are also being conducted for the slow learners of UG Ist year. Coaching classes for the preparation of various competitive examinations like NET, SLET and P.S.C. are also being conducted.

Under the aegis of Swami Vivekanand Career Guidance Cell various training programs and placements sessions (College Campus interviews) were organized. As a result 322 students were selected for placement with a package of 1.22-3.4 Lac per annum. International Training and Placement program was started as Pilot Project by M.P. Govt. in which National Education Foundation (NEP) and State University of New York (SUNY) collaborated with State Government. Various activities of the college are being conducted through different organizing Committees.

To address the issues related to student support and progression Tutor-Guardian Scheme is working effectively in which each teacher is allotted 30-50 students to mentor. Other Committees like Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Committee, Student Advisory Committee and Sexual Harassment Redressal Cell deal with students issues and needs.

The College library has excellent collection of more than 65000 books. Inflib NET and DelNET facility is available in the college.

Students have keenly participated in NCC and NSS activities and represented at State and National level. College students have excelled in various International and National sports tournaments and brought laurels in State Youth Festival.

To promote standard in research, networking, linkages and collaborations with other organizations are done which result in MoUs which help in research outcomes. At present there are 34 Research Scholars registered in different subjects. There are about 50 research publications in journals with high impact factor. Major and minor research projects with relevant research themes are undertaken by the faculty.

The college aims at overall development of its students and prepares them as responsible citizens of the country.

The College lays due emphasis on the upkeep of infrastructure facilities. It has a maintenance committee that takes care of periodical maintenance and repairs. The College engages the services of carpenters, electricians, plumbers, gardeners and sanitaryworkers to maintain the furniture, electric appliances, water supplies, garden and cleanliness of the campus. Apart from regular maintenance, the College frequently augments its infrastructure as per growing needs. During the last five years, the College has constructed 08 spacious class-rooms, a well-equipped smart class cum conference hall, computer laboratories, a ramp up to first-floor and individual parking sheds. Besides, the entire floor, platforms and open stage have been revamped.

Library as a learning resource [advisory committee, its composition, facilities & services (eprint), annual improvement initiatives].

The Library has an Advisory Committee that consists of a convener and three to five senior faculty members with a Librarian as member secretary.

The Committee ensures:

- Call for list of textbooks, reference books and journals from all Departments;
- Review of demands placed by the Departments in view of the available funds & justification for purchase;



- Purchase of Books as per prevalent stock purchase rules;
- Proper entry of Books in the accession register, stacking and labeling;
- Library resources, reference books, text books, reprographic facility, CDs, DVDs, charts, maps, e-facilities like on-line journals/ study material available with DELNET, InfLibNet, N-List etc., are adequately available for all the staff & students and resources are optimally utilized;
- Number of footfalls and corresponding services rendered by the library.
- The library is open from 10:30 am to 5:30 pm on all working days. Magazines, Newspapers, Reference books & Research Journals and old question papers are made available on the display shelf.
- Books for competitive exams like India Today, CSR, Pratiyogita Darpan etc. are made available in the Reading Room.
- Smart cards are provided for issue and return of books through bar code.
- Pass words are provided to the Staff and the Students for free online access through DELNET, InfLibNet & N- List.

The teachers regularly makes of ICT for presentations, consultation and in turn motivate the students to prepare their assignments, notes, book reviews, and reference material with the help of ICT.

The teachers have attended workshops on teaching skills& satellite communication and a dozen of teachers are engaged in delivering lectures through SATCOM or virtual classes.

These lectures are made available to all students, irrespective of geographical boundaries, through you-tubes.

- College Administrative Office: Office is furnished with high configured systems and printers. The office is well connected with internet & Wi-Fi, Close circuit cameras and Biometric system to monitor the movement of the staff.
- **Digital Library:** There are five computers available for the students and teachers to access the electronic resources.
- **Technology Enabled Classrooms:** The College has one Smart class room with interactive board and internet connection.
- Accessibility: The students and teachers both have ease of access to all facilities available in the college.
- Financial assistance: SC / ST, OBC and economically weaker sections Students from weak socio-economic background are provided scholarships, Book bank facility and free stationery.
- Students to participate in various conferences in India and abroad Students are encouraged to attend and present their research papers in National & International Conferences in India. However, there is no provision of reimbursement of travelling expenses from the college.
- Personal enhancement & development schemes: In order to promote the participation of students in co-curricular activities, extension activities and job-oriented projects, the students are given opportunities every now and then; their endeavors are endorsed and acknowledged at appropriate platform.
- The students willing to serve the community are inspired to get registered in the National Service Scheme, through which they create awareness on education, civic rights and duties, government schemes available for the benefit of society. The 'Janbhagidari Samiti' helps to ensure infrastructural requirement and provides fund for various activities of the College. Being the prime beneficiary of the entire system, the students are also invited in Board of Studies, Working Committees and Activity Cells to participate in policy making processes.
- Extracurricular activities: The College organizes a number of programs to motivate students for participation in extra-curricular activities. These include Fresher's Party, Youth Festival and Annual Function etc. The selected students are sent to inter



institutional, inter-university competitions and still to higher levels. Students are given weightage for proficiency in sports/ NCC/ NSS at the time of admission. Players are given a sports kit, a uniform and a daily allowance for those dayson which they actually participate in a tournament.
