1. Principal's Report

I take great pleasure in presenting the Annual Report (2019 - 2020) of Sarojini Naidu Govt. Girls P. G. (Auto.) College, Bhopal, documenting its development and achievements.

The year 2019 - 2020 was marked with many events and success stories along with challenges faced due to global pandemic COVID-19. This can be attributed to the dedication and team spirit of the members of staff and students.

Our college is one of the premier institutes of the state for quality education to women. Since its inception in 1970, college has achieved considerable heights in academic excellence and extracurricular perfection. College celebrated its Golden Jubilee year with full zeal and enthusiasm

The College has been awarded **'A' Grade** in 2017 with 3.09 points by NAAC in cycle III of Re-accreditation. After fourth review of Autonomy in 2019 further extension has been granted by the UGC. Currently the College has 5486 students enrolled in various disciplines. In 2019-20 total admission in UG courses is 1836 and 653 in PG Courses. Among the newly admitted students 1624 are Medhavi students. Under graduate courses are running in 5 faculties, namely, Arts, Commerce, Science, Home Science and Computer Application. Post Graduate programs are successfully running in 21 Subjects along with 17 self-financing courses.

M.Phil program is being run by Departments of History, Economics and Sociology. The college is Center for Ph.D. in 17 subjects. We are proud to attain 94% result in UG and 94.07% result in PG in the last exams. The College has 110 highly qualified regular academic staff and 32 guest faculties. We are honoured to have 4 Professors with D. Litt. in our College.

The college is proud of some distinguished members of the faculty who brought laurels to the institute by bagging many awards. Dr. Shobha Shrivastava, HOD, Deptt. Of Botany, won the Award for best Senior Scientist. Dr. Shashi Kiran Nayak, Professor, Economics was honoured with Mahila Diwas Samman, Neeraj Sahitya Ratna Samman & Sikshak Diwas Samman. My hearty congratulations to both the awardees.

Some members of faculty serve as resource persons in different professional development programs. A few of our faculty have a distinction of being reviewers and editorial board members of National and International Journals of various disciplines.

The Under Madhya Pradesh Higher Education Quality Improvement Project (MPHEQIP), a World Bank Project initiative, our college received a grant of Rs. 8.6 crores for new construction and renovation. We also received furniture, lab equipments, vending machine and incinerator for sanitary napkins and tally accounting software which were duly installed and are in use.

Remedial classes are being run successfully and proven to be very beneficial for our students. Student tracking is a successful endeavour, in which 1168 Students were tracked in 2018-19 & 1193 in 2019-19. This year (2020 - 21) student tracking is in progress.

The institution follows a democratic and participatory mode of Governance with all stakeholders participating actively in administrative and managerial levels. There are about 50 committees functioning in the college to conduct various Extension Activities. The Student Advisory Committee gives opportunity to students to enhance their Leadership & Managerial Skills.

Swami Vivekanand Career Guidance Cell conducts various training Programs & Placement Sessions giving opportunities to students to acquire employment. In the session 2019 – 2020 due to the pandemic placement interview could be conducted only till February. Amazon, Byju's & R-Tech selected students for placement. International Training & Placement Program commenced as a pilot project by Govt. of M.P. in which National Education Foundation & State University of New York (SUNY) collaborated. The Govt. of M.P. signed an MoU with the University of Cambridge in which Cambridge Assessment English Program was successfully conducted benefitting more than 60 students of the college.

To address the issues related to Student Support & Progression, Tutor – Guardian Scheme works effectively by deputing Teachers to be Mentors of 30 - 60 students. Various scholarships for S.C./S.T./O.B.C. are monitored by the committees that ensure that students eligible for the same apply timely. Pratibha Kiran Yojna, Gaon Ki Beti Yojna, Nirdhan Chatra Sahayta Nidhi, Scholarship for Minority & Awas Yojna are few schemes for the girl students run by the Govt. of M.P which are helpful in encouraging girls to pursue higher education.

The college library has excellent collection of more than 65,000 books, INFLIBNET and DELNET facility is available for the students and faculty.

The NCC & NSS wings of the Institute play a vital role in giving opportunity to the students to represent at the State & National Level Camps and Activities. The cadets of rank senior under officer & under officer participated in cultural programs held under 'Ek Bharat Shreshtra Bharat Camp' organized in J&K in 2019 – 20. Under Officer rank cadets participated in All India Girls Tracking Camp held in Ajmer in 2019.

The Grievance Redressel Cell, Anti-Ragging Committee, Student Advisory Committee and Sexual Harassment Redressel Cell deal with students' issues and needs.

Job Oriented Project Work lays guidance for entrepreneurship development, encouraging innovation and personality development. The Enabling Unit actively support & takes care of the co-curricular & academic activities of the students with special needs.

Along with other awareness programs, awareness towards wearing masks and maintaining distance & proper sanitization was spread among the employees and the students, through Alumni Meet

The college has been imparting academic excellence through E-content development. The Faculty has been rigorously broadcasting & uploading e- contents on You tube via mppg and mpug online e contain lecture audio-video lectures.

Series of Guest lectures by eminent educationists are being organized from time to time.

Webinar with the participation of national and international experts add to academic fraternity, helping us impart and exchange ideas to achieve academic excellence.

National Webinar held in June, 2020 "On Curricular Aspects : NAAC Criterion 1", sponsored by World Bank Project, MPHEQIP was a remarkable achievement. "**Report Cum Research Compendium of National Webinar**" was published with an ISBN Number. The Book release was held on 2nd November 2020.

Networking, linkages and collaborations with other organizations are made to promote standards in research. Presently there are 139 Research Scholars registered in different subjects. There are about 50 research publications in journals with high impact factor. Major and minor research projects with relevant research themes are undertaken by the faculty.

The college aims at overall development of its students and prepares them as responsible citizens of the country by propagating learning, sharing and consequently earning.

It offers plenty of scope for vertical mobility in terms of PG courses, M.Phil and PhD programs. Recently, three new Certificate Courses have been introduced by the College.

Almost all departments of the College have established linkages with the nearby institutions to facilitate internship/ on the job training for final year students.

The College lays due emphasis on the upkeep of infrastructure facilities. It has a maintenance committee that takes care of periodical maintenance and repairs. The College engages the services of carpenters, electricians, plumbers, gardeners and sanitary workers to maintain the furniture, electric appliances, water supplies, garden and cleanliness of the campus. Apart from regular maintenance, the College frequently augments its infrastructure as per growing needs. During the last five years, the College has constructed 08 spacious class-rooms, a well-equipped smart class cum conference hall, computer laboratories, a ramp up to first-floor and individual parking sheds. Besides, the entire floor, platforms and open stage have been revamped.

Library as a learning resource: [advisory committee, its composition, facilities & services (e-print), annual improvement initiatives].

The Library has an Advisory Committee that consists of a convener and three to five senior faculty

members with a Librarian as member secretary. The Committee ensures -

- Call for list of textbooks, reference books and journals from all Departments;
- Review of demands placed by the Departments in view of the available funds & justification for purchase;
- Purchase of Books as per prevalent stock purchase rules;
- Proper entry of Books in the accession register, stacking and labelling;
- Library resources, reference books, text books, reprographic facility, CDs, DVDs, charts, maps, e-facilities like on-line journals/ study material available with DELNET, INFLIBNET, N-List etc., are adequately available for all the staff & students. Consequently resources are optimally utilized;
- Number of footfalls and corresponding services rendered by the library.
- The library is open from 10:30 am to 5:30 pm on all working days. Magazines, Newspapers, Reference books & Research Journals and old question papers are made available on the display shelf.
- Books & magazines for competitive exams like India Today, CSR, Pratiyogita Darpan etc. are made available in the Reading Room.
- Smart cards are provided for issue and return of books through bar code.
- Pass words are provided to the Staff and the Students for free online access through DELNET, INFLIBNET & N- List.

IT enabled services: The teachers regularly use ICT for presentations, consultation and there by motivating the students to prepare their assignments, notes, book reviews, and reference material. The teachers have attended workshops on teaching skills& satellite communication. Some of the teachers are engaged in delivering lectures through SATCOM or virtual classes.

These lectures are made available to all students, irrespective of geographical boundaries, through You Tube.

- College Administrative Office: Office is furnished with high configured systems and printers. The office is well connected with internet & Wi-Fi, Close circuit cameras and Biometric system to monitor the movement of the staff.
- Digital Library: There are five computers available for the students and teachers to access the electronic resources.
- Technology Enabled Classrooms: The College has one Smart class room with interactive board and internet connection.
- Accessibility: The students and teachers both have ease of access to all facilities available in the college.
- Financial assistance: SC / ST, OBC and students from weak socio-economic background are provided scholarships, book bank facility and free stationery.
- Students to participate in various conferences in India and abroad Students are encouraged to attend and present their research papers in National & International Conferences. However, there is no provision of reimbursement of travelling expenses from the college.
- Personal enhancement & development schemes: In order to promote the participation of students in co-curricular activities, extension activities and job-oriented projects, the students are given ample opportunities. Their endeavors are endorsed and acknowledged on appropriate platform.
- The students willing to serve the community are inspired to get registered in the National Service Scheme, through which they create awareness on education, civic rights and duties, government schemes available for the benefit of society. The 'Janbhagidari Samiti' helps to ensure infrastructural requirement and provides fund for various activities of the College. Being the prime beneficiary of the entire system, the students are also members in Board of Studies, Working Committees and Activity Cells to participate in policy making processes.
- **Extracurricular activities:** The College organizes a number of programs to motivate students for participation in extra-curricular activities. These include Dikshaarambh

Induction Program, Youth Festival and Annual Function etc. The selected students are sent to inter-institutional, inter-university competitions and to still higher levels. Students are given weightage for their achievements in sports/ NCC/ NSS at the time of admission. Players are given a sports kit, a uniform and a daily allowance for those days on which they actually participated in the tournament.

The College has a sports calendar through which information regarding inter institutional, university level, divisional level, state and national level tournaments are circulated. To ensure maximum participation in sports, the College has a tie-up with Coaching Complexes available in the city.


Role of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in academic audit and initiating quality assurance strategies and processes
