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1. Principal's Report



Sarojini Naidu Government Girls Postgraduate (Autonomous) College, popularly known as '**Nutan College**', has held its status of being an esteemed institution since its inception in 1970. The vision and mission of the institute are in accordance with the policies of the nation at large, aiming at an objective and inclusive growth of the students. It extends its reach to students of every strata of society. The aim of the institution is to go beyond core academics and strive hard to tap the physical, social, intellectual, emotional, artistic, creative as well as spiritual potential of its students who constitute the major percentage of stake holders.

It is indeed a matter of great pride that the college has been awarded grade 'A' in 2017 with 3.09 points by NAAC in cycle III of accreditation. Another feather in the cap was the grant of Autonomy in 2019 by the UGC. A total number of 3077 students are enrolled in various disciplines and courses. The college offers 5 disciplines - Arts, Commerce, Science, Home Science and Computer Application to the students at the UG and PG Level. Adequate infrastructural facilities are provided to the students for teaching-learning in terms of class-rooms, laboratories, smart classes, IT enabled class rooms, computing equipments etc. The World Bank Project of Higher Education has funded for the construction of 13 rooms, a central laboratory, IT complex, and a guard room in the hostel, the works are in progress.

The students of the institute have won laurels in the field of sports, NCC and NSS. The Department of Sports has trained 20 commandos for the college. One of the students of the college Ku. Anchal Sharma participated in the Republic Day Camp in New Delhi from 1st to 31st Jan. 2022 and subsequently represented Madhya Pradesh Team in the parade at Rajpath as right marker.

Under the MPHEQIP various activities were conducted by departments to benefit students in their subjects. The college is adorned with 127 highly qualified academic staff including guest faculty. Various Committees which are formed to extend a support system to the students play a vital role. The Tutor-Guardian committee maintains a record of each student's performance, provide guidance and also counsel them when required. Swami Vivekanand Career Guidance cell makes all efforts to provide hands-on training, conducts workshops, guest lecturers etc to equip the students to "earn while they learn" and also conducts campus employment drives to facilitate their placement. All efforts are made to develop the personality of the students by providing them opportunity to enroll in NSS & NCC. Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat enables students to acquaint themselves with students of other states and learnt harmony and feeling of belongingness.

IQAC took a huge leap by setting up a Legal Aid Clinic on 29 June 2021, formed under a Central Government Scheme, coordinating with the District Legal Services Authority. The Clinic has hence motivated students to share their personal issues and helped them to attain judicial guidance. Enabling Unit which is responsible to make higher education accessible to the specially abled students was glorified when 04 of its ex-students got placements in Bank as PO, Hindi language officer clerks. The Students were facilitated by the Honorable Minister of Higher Education Shri



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Mohan Yadav. Wheel chairs have been donated by the SBI and staff club. One of the wheel chairs was given to a student Ms. Bharti Dongre and another to a physically challenged employer of the college Mr. Santosh Kevat.

The Psychology department has a counselor to resolve the issues of the students. The Girls common Room accommodates students to be at their free will. The institution firmly believes in providing fool proof security by hiring extensive surveillance 24/7 monitored by well-maintained CCTV cameras. Well trained and alert women security guards are posted at the entrance. The Alumni Club known as NOGA (Nutan Old Girls Association) flourishes a spirit of belongingness and responsibility towards the institution. The alumni visit the college and interact with students sharing with them job opportunities, career prospects in various fields, thus boosting the morale of the students studying in the college. Many of the Alumni extend financial support to students by paying their fees. 11 MoUs' with organizations helps to develop linkages and collaboration, thus providing a platform to promote research and networking in various fields of academics. 03 research scholars are registered in different subjects. 37 Research Publications in peer reviewed journals. 04 Projects have been take in up by faculty of the institutions.

The College lays due emphasis on the upkeep of infrastructure facilities. It has a maintenance committee that takes care of periodical maintenance and repairs. The College engages the services of carpenters, electricians, plumbers, gardeners and sanitary workers to maintain the furniture, electric appliances, water supplies, garden and cleanliness of the campus. Apart from regular maintenance, the College frequently augments its infrastructure as per growing needs. During the last five years, the College has constructed 08 spacious class-rooms, a well-equipped smart class cum conference hall, computer laboratories, a ramp up to first-floor and individual parking sheds. Besides, the entire floor, platforms and open stage have been revamped.

The Library has an Advisory Committee that consists of a convener and three to five senior faculty members with a Librarian as member secretary.

10. IT enabled services

The teachers have attended workshops on teaching skills & satellite communication and a dozen of teachers are engaged in delivering lectures through SATCOM or virtual classes.

These lectures are made available to all students, irrespective of geographical boundaries, through you-tubes.

- **College Administrative Office:** Office is furnished with high configured systems and printers. The office is well connected with internet & Wi-Fi, Close circuit cameras and Biometric system to monitor the movement of the staff.
- **Digital Library:** There are five computers available for the students and teachers to access the electronic resources.

- **Financial assistance:** SC / ST, OBC and economically weaker sections Students from weak socio-economic background are provided scholarships, Book bank facility and free stationery.
- **Students to participate in various conferences in India and abroad** Students are encouraged to attend and present their research papers in National & International Conferences in India. However, there is no provision of reimbursement of travelling expenses from the college.
- **Personal enhancement & development schemes:** In order to promote the participation of students in co-curricular activities, extension activities and job-oriented projects, the students are given opportunities every now and then; their endeavors are endorsed and acknowledged at appropriate platform.
- The students willing to serve the community are inspired to get registered in the National Service Scheme, through which they create awareness on education, civic rights and duties, government schemes available for the benefit of society. The 'JanbhagidariSamiti' helps to ensure infrastructural requirement and provides fund for various activities of the College. Being the prime beneficiary of the entire system, the

- electricity distribution utility of Azure Power Roof Top Five Pvt Ltd. From where it is transferred to MPEB from where direct saving in electrical bills are available on monthly basis.

1. Sensor-based energy conservation

- *The overhead storage tanks are provided with sensors/alarm to prevent overflow during lifting of water from the sump well by the motors. Thus helps in reducing the consumption of energy.*

2. Use of LED bulbs/ power-efficient equipment

- *The institute has already implemented various measures regarding conservation /alternative use of energy viz. using LED bulbs and power efficient equipment, solar panels etc.*
- Strict instruction to switch off the electric equipments after use.
- Glass windows in the classroom facilitate the maximum utilization of natural light.

1. Solid waste management

- The college encourages the process of eco friendly waste disposal method.
- In the common areas there are single bins kept, the bins are using black liners for waste collection.

- The reduction of paper waste because by implementing paperless policies we were able to: save money, reduce waste.



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- all housekeeping staffs are trained to segregate waste at source before the waste is dumped for disposal
- The college also generates a huge amount of Garden waste which is mostly in the form of leaves which is deposited in separate chamber and composted to form manure and used for organic farming
- The other paper wastes are sent out through our regular scarp vendors.

2. Liquid waste management

- The waste chemicals mixed water from laboratory passes through concealed pipe line into soak pit.
- Liquids are diluted by getting mixed with the washroom and toilet liquid wastes in to the
- common drainage.

3. E-waste management

- The E-waste collected is stored in a box and disposed accordingly.
- The Empty toners, cartridges, outdated computers and electronic items are sold as scrap to ensure their safe recycling.
- Old monitors and CPUs are repaired by our technician and reused. (Yadav sir will send the answers)

4. Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

There is zero radioactive waste from the collage there are no hazardous chemical waste only diluted acid and alkalis are generated from chemistry lab. Which are collected in a tank through drain pipes. Every month this liquid waste will be tested, neutralized and then will be mixed to the main drain.

Under smart city project Modular rain water recharge system was set up to use rain water for the utilization of institute.
